Financial Aid Tuition Subsidy for Preschoolers

I 、 Background

Generally speaking, the children and young people living in children's homes do not have good academic performances, and moreover, an increasing number of children and young people have attended resource rooms. Due to the two factors described above, the Chinese Childrenhomes and Shelter Association (CCSA) aims to encourage the enrollment of preschools for children in the children's homes as to enhance their cognitive development and social adjustment abilities by providing "Tuition Subsidies for Preschoolers" for children under age six.

II 、 Target Groups

1. Children who will enroll in primary schools by September 2006
2. Children of 4-6 years old who will attend preschool by the end of September 2006.

In 2006, CCSA had provided for 70 children of 12 children's homes around Taiwan, including 35 children in Mandarin phonetic symbol class and 35 children in pre-schools as shown in Table 1.

V 、 How We Provide Tuition Subsidies

1. Mandarin Phonetics Class in Summer Holidays

Each participant would be able to receive two month tuition subsidies, at most of NT\$ 5,000 per month.

2. Preschool Tuition subsidies

Each participant would be able to receive 12 months, at most of NT\$ 5, 000 per month.

VII · Feedback from residential workers

(1) Social workers from Taipei Children Welfare Center, Taipei:

After completing Mandarin phonetics classes, children have learned how to pronounce mandarin phonetic alphabets properly. After schools open, our residential care workers will keep observing their learning process and help strengthening their mathematic skills as well.

(2) Social workers from Hong-Hua Children's home, TaoYuan:

Children have improved their Mandarin phonetics comprehension greatly. Moreover, children also have gained more Mandarin phonetics pronunciation practice.

(3) Social workers from Guang- Yin Children's Home, Taichung:

Children have made great progress in upgrading overall academic performance. We will continue to encourage and support children in order to reinforce their continuing learning spirit. After completing classes, even some children are more willing to talk to care workers and friends with clear pronunciations.



Financial Aid

Tuition Subsidy for Junior/ Senior Secondary School and College Students

I 、 Background

Education is the best way to eradicate extreme poverty and to promote the quality of manpower; it is also a significant opportunity for disadvantaged children to have a bright future. In this reason, CCSA has unified social resources to subsidize tuition for children and care leavers from children's homes.

II 、 Target Group

1. Youths in children's homes who will be third-graders in junior secondary school or senior secondary school on September 2006.
2. Youths in children's homes who will be entering in college on September 2006
3. Youths who have left children's homes less than 5 years and will be third-graders in junior secondary school or senior secondary school on September 2006.
4. Youths who have left children's homes less than 5 years and will be entering college on September 2006.

IV 、 Subsidy

1. For third-graders' supplementary learning in junior secondary / senior secondary school:
 - To subsidize educational fees for supporting and enhancing their learning for 2 semesters
 - At most of NT\$ 15,000 for each student each semester
2. For high school students:
 - To subsidize tuition fees for 2 semesters
 - At most of NT\$ 10,000 for each public school student each semester
 - At most of NT\$ 20,000 for each private student each semester
3. For college students:
 - To subsidize tuition fees for 2 semesters
 - At most of NT\$ 15,000 for each public college student each semester
 - At most of NT\$ 30,000 for each private college student each semester
4. For care leavers:
 - To subsidize daily expenses for 2 semesters
 - At most of NT\$ 10,000 for each student each semester

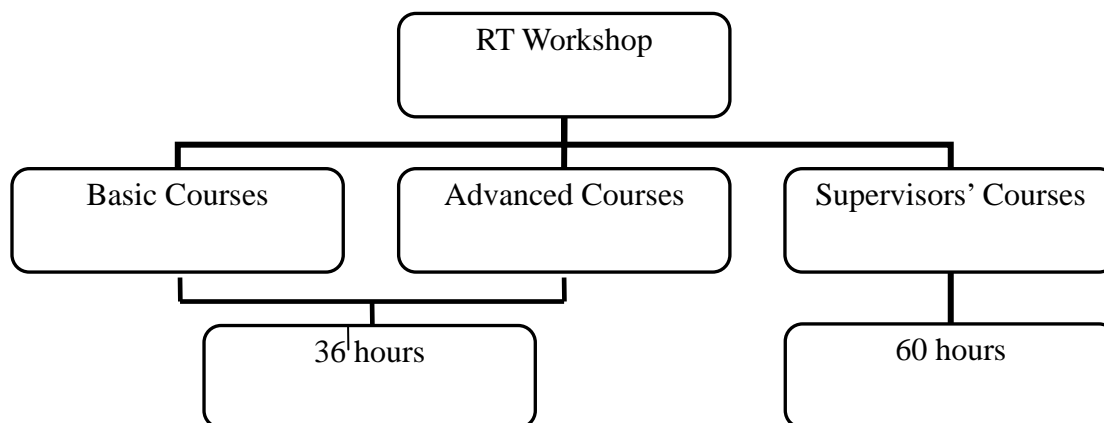

Relation Therapy (RT) Workshops for Residential Workers in Children's Homes and Halfway Home

I 、Background

Initially, it is important for residential workers to build up open and honest relationships with children and young people living in children's homes or halfway homes. It says that the "secure attachment relationship" for counseling is similar to "tightening-shoelaces" for jogging. It is the most precious gift not only for children and young people but also for professionals. Further, the professional benefits from this relationship as they go through a self-realization stage. Therefore, the Chinese Childrenhome & Shelter Association (CCSA) intends to carry out RT workshops including basic, advanced and supervisors' courses in order to upgrade professionals' counseling competences and abilities.

1. One or two experienced clinical children psychologists would lecture the theoretical backgrounds, demonstrate counseling skills, case practices and hold case conferences. RT comes through a series of stages "the biological family", "Who I am" and "sensitive relationship" step by step to guide self-awareness of participants.
2. This project provides a supportive platform for those supplementary of nursery schools & juvenile institution or relate field of interactive opportunity not only in experience but also in professional field development.

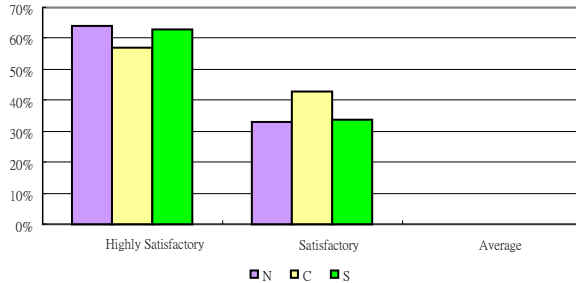

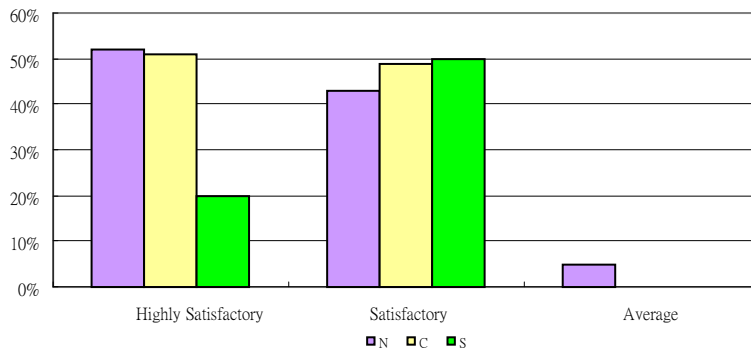
Cognition

In North/Central/South areas, 90 % of the participants expressed that they understand the basic principles, theory and construction of RT.



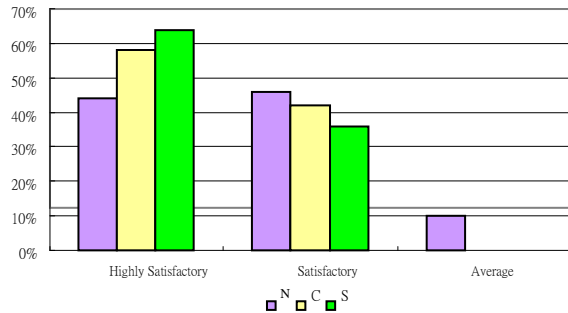
Attitude

In North/Central/South areas, 90 % of the participants expressed that they are willing to apply the RT theory into their counseling.



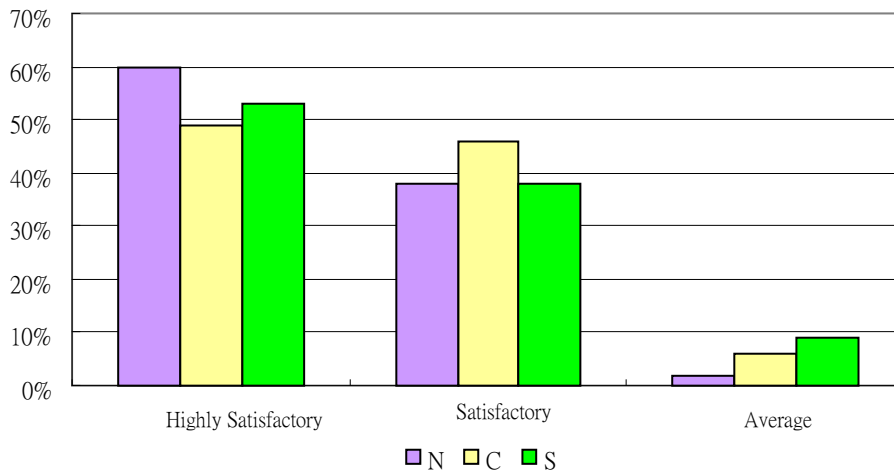
Skills

In North/Central/South areas, 90 % of the participants would establish more concrete relation with service-users while consulting by making use of RT consulting skills.



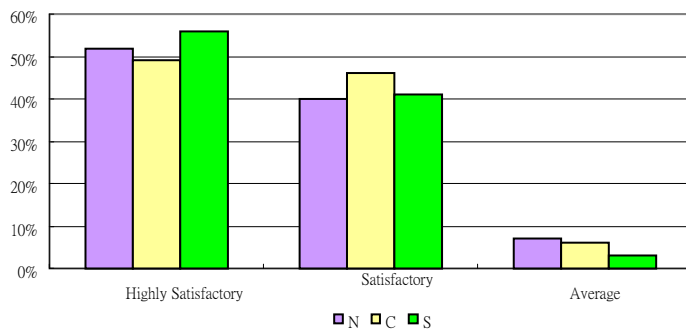
Behaviour

Core Value

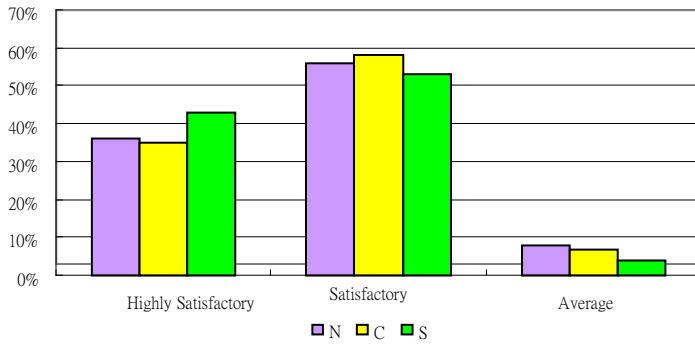
In North/Central/South areas, 90% of all the participants expressed that they would apply the RT theory to deal with clients with deviant behavior problems.



VII、Feedbacks on schedule, venue and instructors arrangements

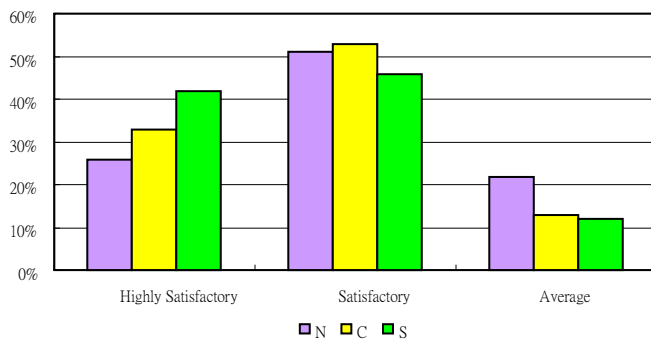
Schedule Arrangement

Over 92% participants are satisfied and around 90% of all the participants have attended the entire workshop.



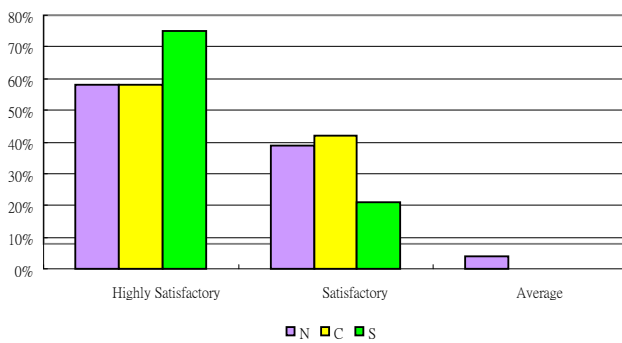
Venue Arrangement

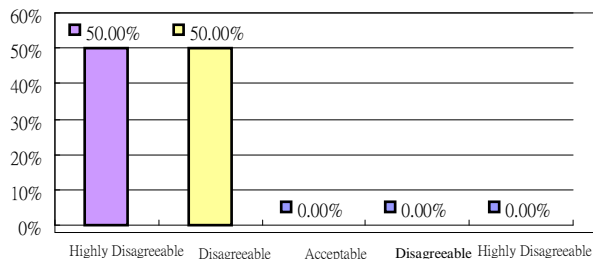

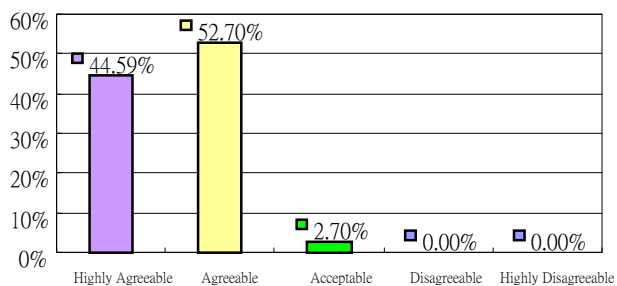

In North/Central/South areas, 100% of all the participants understand "consulting factors".



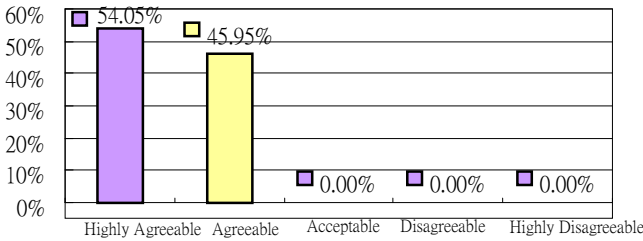
Skills

Attitude

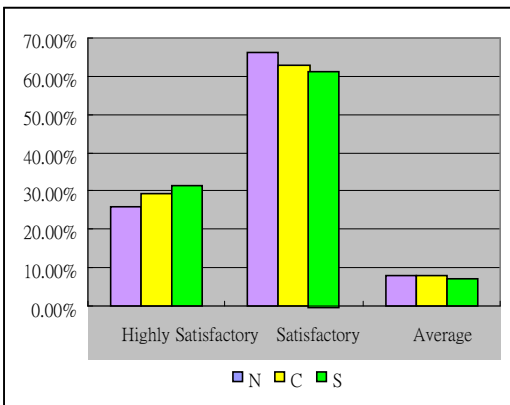
In North/Central/South areas, 100 % of all the participants are willing to apply basic principles, theory and construction of RT in to practices.

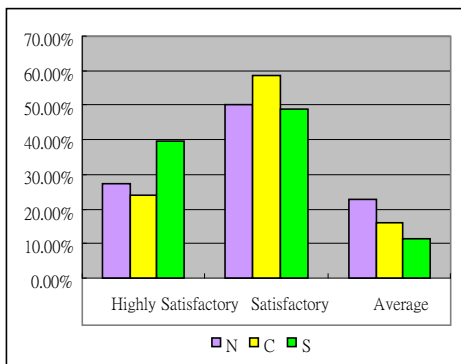
Schedule Arrangement

Over 92% participants are satisfied with it. Participants from north area suggest it would more flexible if the lunch time is longer.



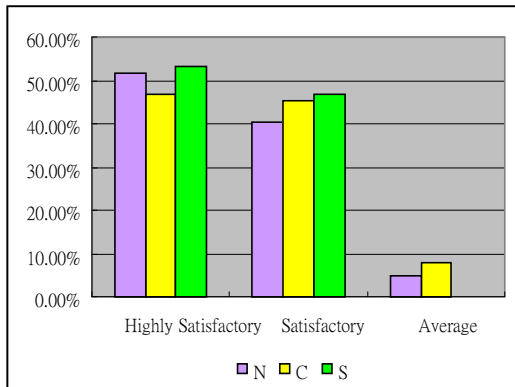
Venue Arrangement

Quality Control Scheme for Children' Shelter Home – Introducing the E-Management System

I 、 Background

Chinese Childrenhome and Shelter Association (CCSA), is a charitable organization concerned with the future development of homeless children and the growing disparity between urban and rural organizations. It dedicates to advocate for the best interests of children, to provide professional trainings for teachers, to offer children counseling services so as to prevent misbehaviors and subsidizing early childhood/vocational education. In response to the current global trends and policies of NPO Management of Trust and Responsibility, CCSA actively assists shelter homes in improving technology and efficiency by providing electronic management software and technical knowledge for staff. All these efforts are intended to provide children with well-rounded care & aptitude development and to ensure that every child can grow up in a healthy environment.

In 2006, CCSA provided further support to 15 children's homes and 5 youth's halfway homes by improving internal information technology, such as accounting, donation, HR, volunteer, case management, and other areas of administrative system in the hopes of putting the "e" management program into effect.
